forward to seeing more of the same next year.

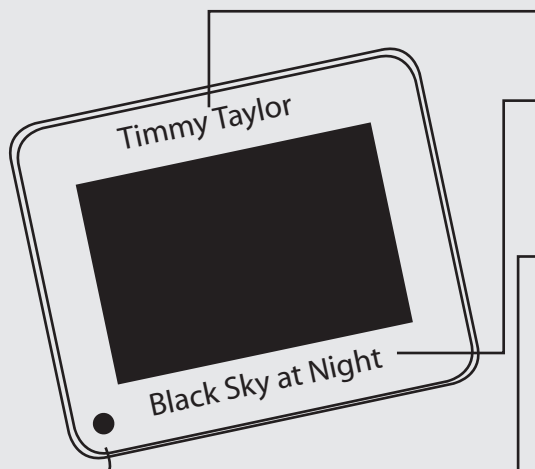
There will be alot of notices that will need to be displayed in this issue, but don't worry. I will have some hints and tips as well.

FOCAL PLANE TOP TIP

Setting up a slide for presentation



1. Stick your name on it so we know who to give the honors to
2. Purely optional, but a photo says so much more with a title
3. Hold the slide up to the light and when you can see the photo the right way up, put a dot on the bottom left hand corner of the slide
