Would you rather receive a begrudging "acceptance" or a constructive "pass"?

Please note that images are required to be saved as jpeg, sRGB colour space, resolution 72ppi with 1400 pixels on the horizontal for landscape and 1050 on the vertical side for portrait and at a file size between 400Kb and 1Mb.

Print Entries

We have created a new, dedicated email address for print competition registrations to streamline the entry process. Please remember to send all print competition registrations to aps.printreg@gmail.com

Print Sizes

A timely reminder about the maximum-minimum size of prints: maximum print size including the matt is 400 mm x 500 mm; minimum print size is 297 mm x 210 mm. All prints must be mounted on firm card and preferably with a matt.

Multiple images may be submitted as a single work provided that the images are all on the same mount and that this mount conforms to the minimum and maximum size requirements.

Framed or glass covered prints will not be accepted.

No late entries will be accepted after 7.45pm regardless of prior registration. Please note that only fully paid financial members of APS can enter the Club competition nights. We also encourage members to assist with setting up the chairs and getting the room ready for the meeting and equally, putting everything away at the end of the night.

The Bit at the End [aka Editorial Musings]

Loosing the Muse:

What do you do when the muse has gone? When you realise that it has been weeks since you have picked up your camera, been inspired to create an image or capture a moment? How do you find the muse again? In a time of change, of disturbance or distraction, finding the inclination for creativity can be – quite simply – hard work.

The platitudes arrive easily......Make the time, put yourself in the moment, find space. If you are not in a creative making mode, look at what other people have done/are doing, soak up the creativity that is evident on websites, in magazines, in exhibitions and here at Club. Platitudes gain that label by being expressions of essential truths so - trite as they may sound at times - there is wisdom within them.

There is truth in simply 'doing'. Even if the resultant images don't ring any bells right now, file them, walk away; rediscover what you may have captured when you are in a more artistically receptive mood. And when the camera is too much of an effort but the ideas are still there? Write them down. Whether a finished image or a concept, however fleeting, capture the idea. For another time.

My muse has been hibernating. Whether it emerges in some future springtime, thin and drawn after a long winter's solitude without sustenance, or whether it emerges refreshed, alive, full of creative spirit is a mystery – the luck of the draw.
